## Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS)

An online feedback is taken from students and is analyzed by obtaining weighted averages for each of the attributes/ parameters. Overall weighted average is also obtained. If the weighted average of one or more parameter is less than 3 , it is presumed that the institute is required to take corrective action. The nature of corrective action to be taken depends upon the parameter/ attributes. The calculation of weighted averages is illustrated below:

No. of stake holders participated in feedback $=\mathrm{N}$
No. of stake holders who have put tick mark in "excellent" column $=\mathrm{X}_{4}$
No. of stake holders who have put tick mark in "very good" column $=X_{3}$
No. of stake holders who have put tick mark in "good" column $=\mathrm{X}_{2}$
No. of stake holders who have put tick mark in "satisfactory" column $=\mathrm{X}_{1}$
No. of stake holders who have put tick mark in "unsatisfactory" column $=\mathrm{X}_{0}$
It is to be noted that $X_{4}+X_{3}+X_{2}+X_{1}+X_{0}=N$
Weighted average of the parameter $\frac{4 * X 4+3 * x 3+2 * X 2+1 * X 1+0 * X 0}{N}$

The above procedure is repeated for all the parameters as per feedback proforma and the average of all the weighted averages, so obtained gives the value of overall weighted average. If the value is less than 3 , then the individual parameters are identified where the score is poor for improvement.

Further, cognizance of suggestion(s)/ comment(s) written by the stake holder in the corresponding column is also studied \& suitable corrective action is taken, if required.
